CATTW CONFERENCE

May 28-29, 1986

The third annual conference of the Canadian Association of Teachers of Technical Writing, to be held at the University of Manitoba, will focus on dialogue--a continuing dialogue between presenters and listeners. The preliminary programme includes papers presented in both languages on the importance of technical communication skills in the engineering profession, using the storyboard method to organize reports, career opportunities in Canada, writing in the organization, and the language of administrative writing in Canada.

There will also be panels on Developing a Curriculum for the Technical Writer on a Career Path, and A Dialogue Between Employers and Teachers; a seminar on Developing a Full-Time Technical Writing Programme; and a workshop on Using Case Studies for Teaching Technical Writing. Finally, a special presentation by the staff of the Technology Communications Department of Winnipeg's Red River Community College will look at such topics as teaching technical communication at British and Canadian colleges, using the "arrow analogy" to teach technical writing, grading reports at a computer terminal, and others.
