# A DEGREE IN TECHNICAL WRITING

The following description of the bachelor's degree in technical writing offered at Oklahoma State University reveals the breadth of the discipline. Graduates are qualified either to teach or to work as professionals in industry.

# A technical writing career

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The technical writer is a specialist who interprets scientific and technical information so that it can be understood by those with a need for it, such as managers (to make a decision), or technicians (for operating equipment), or consumers (for assembling or operating products). The technical writer may work in business, industry, or government writing brochures, research and progress reports, manuals, film or videotape scripts, or any combination. Technical writers work closely with engineers, scientists, doctors, and other technical prersonnel when working on a project.

## Major in Technical Writing
