A cover sheet should show the title of the article, the author's (or authors') name, academic degrees, title, institution, mailing and e-mail addresses. Determination to publish an article will be made by readers from the Editorial Board and others whose expertise relates to the topic of the essay. **Proposals for unsolicited articles** and theory papers for ACPE and AAPC for publication in Volume 33, 2013 should be submitted to the editor by December 1, 2012. Each volume is distributed electronically or in print form in May of each year.
