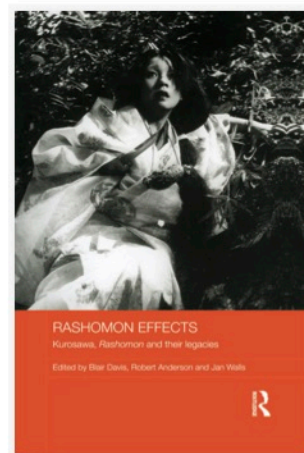


RASHOMON EFFECTS
