Free and Open to the Public Seating is limited The pioneering Canadian communication scholar Dallas Smythe, to whose memory this annual lecture is dedicated, made two study trips to China during that country's pivotal transitional decade of the 1970s, posing a seemingly simple yet also profound developmental question: "After Bicycles, what?" Although post-Mao China has responded with a thunderous "Cars, of course!", China's developmental path is by no means settled. Focusing on communication and cultural politics, this lecture highlights ongoing struggles over the future of China at both elite and popular levels, within domestic and global arenas. Dallas Smythe, I argue, may still receive a different answer, and the global ramifications of an alternative "China path" are tremendous.
