Reader Comment: Safe Winch Launches — an Update

To the Editor,

My paper "Safe Winch Launches" (*Technical Soaring* 37(1)) reports on the outcome of the first 7 years of the BGA safe winch launch initiative.

I am pleased to update these data with results for the 2013 BGA Accident Year which ended recently on September 30, 2013. In this, the eighth year of the initiative, there were no fatal or serious injury winch accidents in BGA gliders.

This means that during the 8 years from 2006–2013 there were 5 fatal or serious injury winch accidents compared with 22

in the previous 8 years and an 8-year average of 24 from 1974 to 2005. Two of the 5 fatal or serious injury winch accidents from 2006–2013 involved a stall or spin in comparison with 17 in the previous 8 years and an 8-year average of 19.5 from 1974 to 2005. This safety initiative continues.
